(South Asian Dementia Awareness)

The group met for the first time on Tuesday 19th November. SADA stands for South Asian Dementia Awareness and also the word SADA in Punjabi means 'our', 'our group'.

The group offers a safe space for people to meet from the South Asian communities in Warrington. If you are living with dementia, you care for someone who has dementia or you would like to support a person living with dementia, why not come along and meet the group.

Led by two volunteers who speak multiple languages, there will be fun and interactive activities with plenty of opportunities to chat and refreshments are provided. The group meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month between 1:30pm and 3:00pm.

The sessions are held in the Living Well Hub (Horsemarket Street, Warrington town centre, WA1 1XL) and provide opportunities to link in with professionals who support people living with dementia and their friends, families and carers.



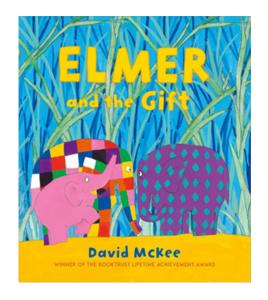

Aunt Zelda knows she is supposed to give something to Elmer... she just can't remember what it is!

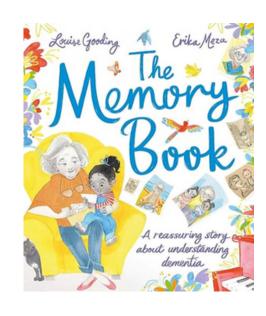
After a heart warming adventure, Elmer and his friends manage to solve the mystery.

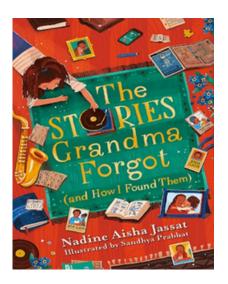
The book also includes a special page from Alzheimer's Research UK to help adults speak to young people about dementia.

What does Good Neighbours Dementia offer to individuals?

We offer support to individuals living with dementia and their care givers to identify and access activities, groups and events that are dementia specific or dementia friendly. We also support, via a network of volunteers companionship visits for those who live alone, are lonely and isolated for a period of 12 weeks.

Do you help care givers?

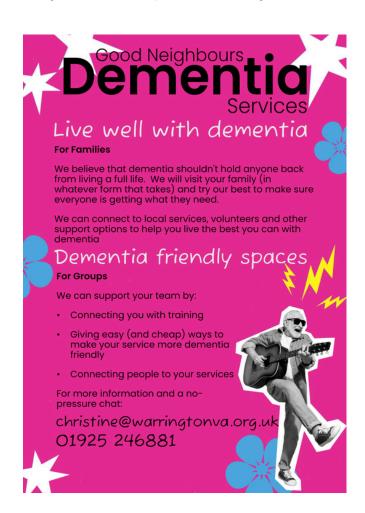
Yes, we support caregivers to navigate the support available, we will introduce to other professionals like Warrington Carers Hub and carer support groups and activities. We will signpost and arrange support from CAB, Adult Social Care and introduce carers to local care homes that offer day care or experience days.

Do you do home visits?

Yes, we arrange a suitable time to visit you in your home to discuss the support you may need with the person who has dementia and their loved one.

Do you support new groups?

Yes, if you are looking to set up a new group we can help you to access training, and provide information to make your group more dementia friendly. We can also connect you with other groups that can offer information and advice.
